

RESOLUTION 2010-25

A RESOLUTION MAKING A SPECIFIC EXEMPTION OF THE GARIBALDI PUBLIC CONTRACTING ORDINANCE ON BEHALF OF THE GARIBALDI CONTRACT REVIEW BOARD TO THE COMPETITIVE BID REQUIREMENTS OF THE GARIBALDI MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 3.10. PUBLIC CONTRACTS, AND AUTHORIZING STAFF TO ACQUIRE COMPETITIVE BIDS FOR THE PAVING OF CITY STREETS IN GARIBALDI.

WHEREAS, the City has appropriated funds in the Fiscal Year 2010-2011 budget for the purpose of maintaining city streets in Garibaldi; and

WHEREAS, state law and Garibaldi Municipal Code authorize use of an alternate contracting method of requesting quotes for a contract less than \$150,000; and

WHEREAS, Garibaldi Municipal Code (GMC) 3.10.090, Public Contracts, allows for specific exemptions when the method of awarding such a bid is unlikely to encourage favoritism or substantially diminish competition for public contracts; and

WHEREAS, the GMC 3.10.090(B) states that a Specific Exemption may be made by the Contract Review Board (City Council) for contracts more than \$5,000 and less than \$150,000 and that such an exemption shall be made by resolution; NOW, THEREFORE,


THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARIBALDI RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Garibaldi Contract Review Board hereby approves the use of an alternate contracting method as a specific exemption to public contracting competitive bid requirements, pursuant to GMC 3.10.090(E).


Section 2. The Garibaldi Contract Review Board authorizes staff to obtain at least three informally solicited competitive quotes for materials and services associated with the paving of Acacia Ave. from 4th Street towards 5th Street, and 4th Street from Acacia Ave. to Garibaldi Ave.

Section 4. The Garibaldi Contract Review Board will authorize the Administrator to enter in to agreement with the lowest competitive bidder upon acceptable documentation associated with recitals of this resolution.
