





REGULAR TOURISM COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES

Thursday, February 27, 2020 – 5:30 p.m.

I. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Judy Riggs called the meeting to order at 5:36 p.m. Present were commissioners Shayna Sheldon, Amanda Cavitt, Brent Olson, Rachael Aldridge, John Luquette, Geoff Wullschlager (City Manager).

Nan Devlin, Executive Director, Tillamook Coast Visitors Association

- IV. PRESENTATIONS
- A. Nan Devlin presents tourism development priorities that the Tillamook Coast Tourism Advisory Committee created in 2015. It was their guiding light for deciding what they do as far as tourism activities and programs to fund. Devlin provides a list containing four principals of sustainable tourism and destination management. Sustainable tourism means people (is it good for the community), place (does it protect and is it respectful to the environment) and profit (does it provide economic vitality).
 - 1. Develop the tourism industry in ways that are social, culturally and ecologically responsible.

Devlin states that Tillamook County differentiates our region for visitors by providing experiences involving outdoor access and education, culinary agritourism, and cultural heritage. Tillamook is more about the experiences rather than just getting "heads in bed" as some other city, like Lincoln City, have done.

2. Prioritize tourism growth that improves economic conditions in shoulder and off-season and supports the economic stability of the workforce.

3. Improve communities' ability to better accommodate tourist and the visitor experience with new, enhanced or better utilization of tourism-related facilities for increased year-round use.

One way would be to help sponsor events or help put on off-season events or bring conferences to Tillamook. Bringing a travel writers event here has been put in the works.

4. Inspire growth in new and traditional industries to support long-term priorities of county tourism.

Helping small fisheries expand their business and bring their product to market and marketing them. Also attempts to get an outdoor outfitter down in Garibaldi for fishing, kayaking and SCUBA diving.

Devlin invites everyone to attend the North Oregon Coast Tourism Community Forum on March 9th in Gearhart.

Garibaldi businesses that had applied and were awarded grant money from Tillamook Coast were the Maritime Museum and OCSR.

Discussion and explanation regarding who Travel Oregon, Oregon Coast Visitor's Association, and Tillamook Coast entities were.

Devlin suggested having 2-3 strategic planning session to decide what are Garibaldi's assets, what are we good at, what can we improve and what do we want to avoid, what are long term goals, tactics for reaching those goals, etc. which will be a great guideline for what the commission should focus on. Devlin offers to help facilitate that meeting to guide the commission and then write up the plan for them.

VI. OLD/NEW BUSINESS

A. By-laws – Discussion on development of structure. Ordinance will be changed to reflect the verbiage regarding primary and alternate seats. Commission decides to rule by majority vote. Decided that a structured timeline and time limits should be formed and to also put a public comment rule into the by-laws.

- B. Garibaldi Days Discussion on history and origins of Garibaldi Days as well as town history as explained by David Laine.
 - -Devlin mentions quality of vendors have declined in years past. Discussion ensues regarding MLM vendors, vendor applications, insurance, etc.
 - -Gierga-Hamilton suggests animals from the wildlife safari, go-cart vendor, more stuff for kids to do.
 - -Theme discussed. Decided on Hoorah for Garibaldi Days, celebrating 60 years. Discussed turning Garibaldi Days back into a community event.

- Suggestions regarding using Old Mill space; potentially Bingo.

- Selfie station
- Movie night free or donation based in Old Mill
- Dunk tank ask for Coast Guard volunteers
- -Concerns regarding parking discussed. Local shuttle discussed.
- -Discussion regarding presentation of businesses on Hwy 101.
- -Jessie Leigh confirmed for Friday night entertainment.
