AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE COLLECTION AND HAULING OF GARBAGE IN GARIBALDI, OREGON, WITHOUT A LICENSE: PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE PEOPLE OF GARIBALDI DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful from and after the passage and adoption of this Ordinance, and its approval by the Mayor, for any person, firm or corporation, to collect or haul garbage for others within the corporate limits of Garibaldi, without first having applied for and obtained a license there-for from the City Recorder.

Section 2. The City Recorder shall, upon request of the Common Council, issue a license to any person, firm or corporation, authorizing him to collect and haul garbage within said City for a period not to exceed 12 months upon the payment of the sum of ^{25.00}~~\$10.00~~ by the applicant for such license; and which said license shall be revocable by the Common Council only if such licensee quits or fails to haul such garbage.

Section 3. No more than one such license shall be issued or remain in effect at the same time.

Section 4. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$50.00 and costs, or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period of 1 day for each \$2.00 of such fine.

Section 5. That Ordinance #13 adopted by the Common Council of Garibaldi on May 13, 1947 by and the same hereby is repealed.

Section 6. It is hereby declared that existing conditions are such that this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety; and an emergency hereby

is declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and adoption by the Common Council and approved by the Mayor of Garibaldi, Oregon.
